Course Name: **Techniques in Egg Tempera**

Materials Students Bring:

- Roll of paper towels
- 2 raw eggs
- Water container (for cleaning brushes)

Safe Art Guidelines:

- **KNOW** your MATERIALS. Obtain material Safety Data Sheets on your art materials. Follow Safety Instructions on all art materials.
- **READ** the SAFE ART notebook in each classroom. Your instructor will go over all safety precautions and any protective equipment you will need. Keep food and drink safely away from art materials.
- Check your art materials for substances that are banned at the League:
- **NO TURPENTINE** is allowed in our building and no products containing turpentine (eg.Copal). Use acetone and ethanol solvents (available in denatured alcohol) such as turpenoid.
- **OTHER** banned substances are: solvents containing benzene (benzol), carbon tetrachloride, toluene (tuluol), xylene (xylol), wood or methyl alcohol. Please **CHECK** the ingredient list of all paint, varnish remover, varnishes, lacquer thinners and rubber cement.
- **FIXATIVE SPRAYS** and **SPRAY PAINT** are not allowed on the premises--which includes the surrounding property.
- Students please do not mix powdered **PIGMENTS** in the building.
- **HANDLING OF MINERAL SPIRITS:** Mineral Spirits should not be poured down the drains. Only bring what you will use to class in a labeled glass container and cap off when not in use.
- There is no solvent storage in the painting studios. Please do not leave your solventcontainers in the building. Bring an extra glass jar with a lid to collect used mineral spirits and take this home with you.
- **NEVER USE SOLVENTS TO CLEAN YOUR HANDS:** Wash your hands with baby oil or vegetable oil, then soap and water.
- **FOR SMALL SOLVENT SPILLS,** bring your own rags to clean up. We no longer have a rag service. Please **TAKE** your wipe-up rags, or paper towels with solvents on them home with you.
- **FOR YOUR PROTECTION:** bring nitrile gloves if you are handling pastels, charcoals, ink, clay, paint or solvents. Bring a dust mask if you will be sanding clay.
